Danzig is to observe Communion on the 13th Sunday, and is to issue a notice to this effect.

#### Notice

To those church members who have received punishment from the church, with the date of exclusion and brief remarks regarding the reason for them having received this punishment.

- 1. On October 18, 1822 Hermann Penner, because of offending the Elder Honor. Abr. Regier from Gurcken, Heubuden Church, was, according to usual custom, with singing and religious speech, excluded from the church, which can be examined further in the church record.
- Note: however, if he acknowledges that the offense is one of overhastiness, not one to call for kneebending in the presence of two witnesses in a closed room from this church and another. Since it was not because of an addiction, but rather for personal satisfaction, the Heubuden Church had to make the decision to exclude him.
- 2. On March 6, 1825 Hanns Tieszen, due to quarreling with and beating his brother-in-law, with agitation by his sister and her husband, to whom he made unnatural visits, causing strife; because of which the Cornelius Thieszen couple is 3. investigating legal divorce.
- as well as the previous behavior of ---- Kroecker from Cabian, who for 20 to 30 years has absented himself from the church, and is pursuing a bad lifestyle, 2 years ago managed to get a disputed amount of 4000f. Both Hanns Tieszen and --- Kroecker, together with added(testimonty) from the brothers, were excluded from the church. Hann Tieszen is not allowed to return, since he served under the Green H?? in Schlessien several weeks, and due to insubordination was deprived of his soldier status, and the Province was to advise him. (He converted to a different religion.)

- 4. On August 26, 1825, the Cornelius Thieszen couple was excommunicated from the church because of divorce; although she was innocent, because of their mutual stubborness they were divorced, namely,
- 5. The following day Cornelius and Agnes Tieszen nee Tieszen his wife were informed by Chairman Hermann Wientz and Heinrich Howenehr of the church's decision. On March 8, 1826, Mrs. Agnes Tieszen demanded that I give her a separation certificate so that she could join another religion.

  Note: Cornelius Tieszen, excommunicated from the churchdue to marital discord and legalized divorce, because of his remorse and following church discipline, was duly and ceremoniously received back into the church on May 4, 1826.
- 6. On May 12, 1826, Mrs. Maria Foht was excommunicated from the church because of an illegitimate birth in January, the notice of which was brought to her by Mr. Hermann Wientz and Mr. Gerhard v. Roy.

  Note: On March 15, 1829 she was again received into the church.
- 7. Franz Bergen, in order to marry outside the church, left with a certificate on July 10, 1826.
- 8. On March 22, 1829 Miss Margarethe Warkentien, who had been working at the home of Rev. Heinrich Claaszen, was notified by Mr. Joh. Penner jun. and Mr. Abr. Kauenhowen, that she had been excommunicated from the church because she was pregnant ("in other circumstances").

9. On August 22, 1831, Eduard Wiebe, because of his consistent disorderly lifestyle and in particular, because of his participation in a civil revolt on July 28, 1831, when with knife in hand, he had threatened an anticsarist and was restrained from behind and his weapon taken away, then taken to prison in Tapian to be punished by the court, was excommunicated from the church, with the notice never to be received again because that would bring shame on the Mennonite Church.

On Sept. 15, 1831 he was given his separation certificate. Punishment publ. on Jan. 16, 1832: Confiscation of his property, 1 year prison sentence and loss of national certificate (citizenship?).

10. Merchant Peter Pennere jun. transfer certificate to a different church January 23, 1832, in order to be able to join the military (came without condition because of faithfulness?).

### Church Growth

With notice from others of our faith, and their previous churches, the following have been transferred (to our congregation):

- 1. Anna Dück, single, with a certificate from Pastwa Hon. Elias v Bergen, belonging to Heubuden, was received into the church through holy baptism. She was born November 26, 1787. Conditioned (instructed?) by Hon. Mr. Hein. Claaszen.
- 2. Isaai Wientz, teacher in the church at Elbing and his wife, Anna nee Wiehler; the latter was, during the time of living there, not received into the church, and so belongs to us; however, Isaai Wiens, withour certificate from there, through Elder Ab. Regier, because of his being here and his station, was received into the church here in 1821.
- 3. Merchant Jacob Goerzen via certificate from Pastwa Hon. Elias v Bergen and Elder Hon. G. Ab. Regier from Heubuden; the same was born Sept. 20, 1801 and baptized there on June 4, 1820.
- 4. Mr. Gerhard v Roy and his spouse, Mrs. Sara nee Fast, via notice from Danzig, dated April 15, 1822; received here by Hon. Elder Mr. Abr. Regier from Heubuden on July 7, 1822 (without foot washing).
- 5. Single lady, Helena Busenitz from Dirschau, working for the wife of Mr. Joh. Kauenhowen, said to have been born in Dirschau on Aug. 23, 1811 and joined the church in Heubuden upon baptism; her father is said to be Anton Busenitz and her mother Helene nee v Rieszen; Aug. 20, 1822. 1814 here at J.K.
- 6. Mr. Jacob DÜck, bachelor, from Ellerwald near Elbing, where he was born on July 20, 1793. On June 19, 1814 was received into the church at Elbing through baptism. Moved to Koenigsberg in June 1821; received into this church by transcript Dec. 26, 1822 by Heinrich Penner.

- 7. Mr. Johann Neustaeter, born in 1774 in the village of Hochzeit near Danzig, was received into the Elbing church through baptism on June 13, 1792. (His wife) Elisabeth nee Jost was born in 1790 in Elbing, and on June 12, 1808 received into the church through baptism; on Feb. 20, 1823, transferred in writing from Elbing. (Through her coming here and promising often to (join?) it was decided that she should submit in writing her wish not to become a member here, but to be regarded as a guest and be permitted to receive the Lord's Supper.)
- 8. Miss Susanna Jantzen, born in Danzig , was received as a member into the Heubuden church through Christian water baptism on May 18, 1818. She moved to Koenigsberg 5th. 1823 to the home of Mr. Abr. Kauenhowen jun., and on May 17,1824, was transfered from the Heubuden church.
- 9. Merchant Mr. Jacob Wiebe, son of Johann Wiebe and wife in Muhlens was born of Mennonite parents on both sides on Sept. 10, 1803, and on June 1, 1823 became a member of Elbing & Ellerwald congregation through holy baptism, and conducted himself as a respectable member; by means of submitting a transcript written by the Hon. Elder Jacob Kroecker, elder in Elbing and Ellerwald on October 12, 1824, was duly received.

Note: Mr. Jacob Wiebe took this certificate with him on his trip to Russia, April 20, 18??

10. Merchant Heinrich Wiehler, son of Isbrand Wiehler in Grosz Gartz, was first received as a member into the Elbing church on July 1, 1821 through holy baptism, and by means of transfer certificate from Teacher A. Wiebe in Elbing, received into our church. L.A., Secretary January 29, 1825.

- 11. Merchant David Claaszen, son of David Claaszen & Sara nee DÜck in Lakendorff, upon confession of his faith and Christian baptism, was received into the Elbing & Ellerwald church as a member on June 9, 1822. Upon transcript from Hon. Elder Jac. Kroecker March 5, 1825.
- 12. Miss Justina Bergmann, legitimate daughter of David Bergmann from Hauskampe in Tiegenhagen June 7, 1818; through Christian baptism was received as a member. Because of commiting an offense was excommunicated from that church, but following remorse and repentance was reinstated into the church as a sister. Certificate dated July 28, 1825 by Hon. Elder Mr. Abr. Wiebe from Tiegenhagen.
- 13. Merchant Mr. Joh. Rempel, son of Leader Mr. Ditrich Rempel from Caldowa near Marienburg; born Aug. 11, 1801, and received into the Mennonite Church in Elbing through Christian baptism on July 20, 1819; and by certificate dated March 28, 1826 by Rev. Ar. Wiebe, transferred April 2, 1826.
  Received Feb. 1, 1829. Footwashing conducted by Mr. Peter Kroecker.
- 14. Mr. Jacob Braun and his wife Helene nee Foth together with his little daughter Maria. Moved from Mowe to Creutzburg. Submitted his church record from the Heubuden Church dated Gurcken Sept. 4, 1826 by Honorable Elder Mr. Abr. Regier, in which is certified that Mr. Jacob Braun of Mennonite parentage was born on August 25, 1782 in Schoenau

near Marienburg, and upon confession of his faith was baptized on June 27, 1802 and received into the Heubuden church. The same made a trip to America in 1815 and returned in 1824. Married his aforementioned wife,

- 15. Mrs. Helen Foth in 1825, who had been born of Mennonite parents on April 22, 1807 in Mowe. On May 19, 1823, upon confession of her faith and baptism, was received into the Heubuden church. According to her father, their daughter Maria was born in Mowe; transferred via certificate to our church.
- 16. Miss Aganetha Dyck, born to Mennonite parents; serving Jacob Braun in Creutzburg; without further birth and membership notices from Honorable Elder Mr. Abr. Wiebe from Tiegenhagen, transferred on Sept. 1, 1826. (returned to Tiegenhoff.)

Note: This certificate was returned to her with the remark, that she had made no use of the church, and her former bread provider (employer?) has heard nothing of her. July 13, 1827.

17. A notice from the Elbing church states that Susana Wiens, daughter of our preacher Hon. Isaac Wiens & deceased wife, Margaretha nee Reimer, was born on June 4, 1816 in Elbing. According to certificate dated June 18, 1828.

18. Peter Kroecker, wine distiller from Braunsburg, who had connected to the Elbing church, moved here at Easter, 1828 with his wife Anna nee Stoesz, bringing their son Cornelius Hermann Kroecker. They submitted a certificate from Elbing from Rev. A. Wiebe, in which the same states that Mr. Peter Kroecker, on June 23, 1816, and his wife, Anna Stoesz, became members at Tiegenhagen on June 4, 1820 through baptism. Her birthdate is not given. However, they note that their son, Cornelius Hermann, was born May 24, 1825, as noted in the church record on page 36.

Following the sermon, they were received into our church on July 13, 1828, with due footwashing, which church members, the Mr. Abr. Kauenhowen couple, literally carried out on Nov. 13, 1828.

Note: The same, on March 24, 1830, gave me a written message from Lutheran Preacher that his wife, Anna nee Stoesz was born on Dec. 22, 1803. Mr. Pet. Kroecker told me that the date of birth was Sept. 26, 1796.

19. Merchant Mr. Jacob von Roy in Braunsburg , according to certificate from Elbing, was baptized and received into the church June 15, 1817; says he was born March 2, 1799 in Altschottland near Danzig. According to certificate March 6, 1828.

Note: Mr. Jacob von Roy, according to a writing dated January 6, 1829, has expressed that he, together with his wife, wishes to stay with the Elbing church because of the proximity to Elbing. As a result he has not been received as a member here.

20. Margaretha Sudermann, daughter of Mr. Abraham Sudermann from Goldschar near Marienburg, was married to Mr. Joh. Rempel from here, and several years ago was received into the Elbing church through baptism, and several years later belonged to the Heubuden church and is reported to live with integrity, all this being reported to us in a certificate on October 25, 1828 by the Hon. Elder Mr. Abram Regier.

Note: Received Feb. 1, 1829. Footwashing carried out by Mrs. Anna Kroecker Stoesz.

21. Mrs. Aganetha v Riesen from Fischerfeld, daughter of Herrman v Rieszen from Elbing. According to a certificate from Teacher Peter Wiebe from Elbing, she was born on July 6, 1801, baptized in 1818 on confession of faith and received as a member of the Elbing church. Married in Elbing to Joh. Wiehler jun. from Koenigsberg on Dec. 28, 1828.

Note: Received Feb. 1, 1829. Footwashing carried out by Miss Gertrude Wiehler from the DZ area on Feb. 4, 1829.

22. Merchant apprentice Julius Wiens, born October 26, 1810, whose father is Cornelius Wiens from Tiegenhagen, according to a written notice by Honorable Elder Mr. Abr. Wiebe from the church in Tiegenhagen.

Note: Above mentioned Julius Wiens has applied to us for religious instruction.

- 23. Renathe Sudermann, who has applied for religious instruction, was born Sept. 18, 1812 to Mennonite parents in Elbing, has been transferred on the basis of a certificate issued by Religion teacher Mr. Isaac Wiens in Elbing on April 23, 1820.
- 24. Eduard Gerhard Stoesz, legitimate son of Cornelius Stoesz and wife Anna nee Claaszen, who has applied for religious instruction, was born in Mohrungen Sept. 30, 1813, according to a birth certificate from the evangelical parish minister Brasche.
- 25. Painting apprentice Cornelius Jantzen from Tiegenhoff, on the basis of a church certificate from Elder Mr. Abr Wiebe of the Tiegenhagen church, was baptized and received into the membership of the Tiegenhagen church on June 9, 1829 (certificate dated June 1, 1830.) With the certificate of March 12, 1832, he left for "the unknown."
- 26. Merchant Gerh. Wientz of Heiligenbeil, through Mr. Peter Kroecker, in January 1831, stated to Chairman Mr. Hermann Wientz, that for this year he does not wish to pay any more to our church, because he wants primarily to stay with the Tiegenhagen church.
- 27. Miss Anna Claaszen, daughter of David Claaszen, born March 20, 1812 in Zeischendorf near Dirschau, according to the certificate from Hon. Elder Mr. Abraham Regier from Gurcken at Heubuden, working for Mr. Heinrich Claaszen.

- 2. Miss Maria Wiens was in the service of President Franz Wiebe because of alleged marriage (ostensibly outside our church), transcribed to Elbing June 17, 1821.
- 3. Not having been received into the church, Frederica Amalia Seeman, for acceptance through baptism in the Reformation church, upon request by the mother was given a certificate. July 4, 1821.
- 4. Fried. Wilh. Kauenhowen, son of Anton Kauenhowen & Elis nee Berlen, baptism certificate, although he is to have converted to another religion earlier, Aug. 23, 1821.
- 5. Jacob Harder, commerce assistant, given 1 notice in writing from the church in Danzig, October 2, 1821.
- 6. Susana Wiens, born in West Prussia, 1 certificate of departure to the Lutheran religion because of marriage to a Lutherna man October 3, 1821.
- 7. Catharina widowed Torburg, nee Foht, church membership certificate because of marriage outside the church, given October 31, 1821. (Reformed.)
- 8. David Wiehler, commerce worker, given a written departure certificate to the Mennonite Church in Russia through Mr. Ber. Wiehler on June 5, 1822.
- 9. Anna Steffen, born in Petershagen, West Prussia, 1 church certificate for acceptance into another religion because of marriage. June 25, 1822 (Reformed)
- 10. Abr. Foht & his wife Maria Wiens given a divorce certificate, because, due to his marriage elsewhere, they were not in any way inclined towards reconciliation. July 19, 1822.
- 11. Berthe Coelestinne Kroeker, not having been a church member, upon her wish and desire, given 1 certificate to join the Reformed Church through baptism. Sept. 13, 1822.

- 12. Widowed Mrs. Bernh. Penner from Cabian went to West Prussia for about a year. Wrote for a certificate of transfer without indicating which church she wanted to join. Sept. 30, 1822. The certificate was returned November 17, 1825.
- 13. Magdalene de Veer requested a departure certificate in order to be able to marry outside our church. Dec. 13, 182?
- 14. Without having been received into the church Adolph Kroecker, son of deceased merchant Joh. Jacob Kroecker & wife Emilie Kroecker nee v Roy, in order to join the Elbing church where his mother had moved, took his certificate on March 14, 1823.
- 15. Miss Helena Busenitz, having been in the service of Widower Joh. Kauenhowen, is moving to Marienburg, including the church at Heubuden. Given her certificate May 1, 1823.
- 16. Carpenter Wilhelm de Ver, given a departure certificate in order to be able to marry outside our religion. Aug. 1, 1823.
- 17. The wine distiller Tiesen couple, namely Cornelius Tiesen & Agnes Tiesen nee Tiesen, were issued a divorce certificate by the state court on March 23, 182?
- 18. Miss Agathe Harder was given a baptism certificate instead of a written notice for an unspecified Mennonite church, also given shortly to her brother, assistant to Mr. Martin Harder. March 24, 1824.
- 19. Commerce worker Julius Wilh. Zimmermann, in order to join another religion so that he could realize his wish to join the military, received his departure certificate on April 2, 1824.

- 20. Miss Lisette Sudermann, in order to be married, was issued her departure certificate on Feb. 16, 1824 by Mr. Peter Tieszen jun., who sent it to Danzig.
- 21. Miss Anna Marie Claaszen, daughter of the deceased Peter Claaszen & Magdalena nee Kroecker, was given her departure certificate to make it possible for her to marry a man of another religion; certificate given January 20, 1825. (1 Joh. 2, v 19.)
- 22. Pavingstone maker Heinrich Olfert given a notice to the church in Danzig Feb. 9, 1825.
- 23. Mrs. Elisabeth Kliewer nee Wiehler given a written notice for the Elbing church, Feb. 9, 1825.
- 24. Miss Catharina Wiehler given a written notice for the Elbing church March 19, 1825.
- 25. Miss Anna Siemens from Danzig, upon her return, given a written notice for Danzig, July 5, 1825.
- 26. Miss Justina Bergmann from Hauskamp is returning to her parents because of her illness & consequently referred to the Tiegenhagen church. Feb. 28, 1826.
- 27. The divorced Mrs. Agnes Teiszen nee Tieszen, given her departure certificate in order for her to join another religion. March 8, 1826.

- 28. Mr. Hans Tieszen, after he had been dismissed from the church, went with his departure certificate of June 18, 1825 over to another religion.
- 29. Miss Magdalena Penner, daughter of the widowed Mrs. Johann Penner in Mamel, because of her marriage to Mr. C.W. Goetz, went over to the Lutheran religion. Certificate issued June 5, 1826.
- 30. Franz Bergen, because of marriage outside our church, went over to another religion. July 3, 1826. (See also Hymn 268, V. 7.)
- 31. Miss Johanna Marianna Reincke, due to her marriage to a man who earlier also had left the church for marriage reasons, left for a Reformation church. Certificate given Nov. 13, 1826.
- 32. Miss Barbara Kauenhowen left because of marriage outside our religion for the Reformation Church; certificate given Nov. 24, 1826.
- 33. Ship captain Jacob Claaszen left our religion for another religion because of marriage reasons, for which he received the church certificate on April 28, 1827. (from H. P. Apr. 15.)
- 34. Miss Christina Penner left her employment with Mr. Abr. Kauenhowen on Sept. 19. 1827, in order to be with her brother-in-law Dyck in Rosenberg near Marienwerder & a written notice has been sent to the Elder Honor. Kroecker of the Elbing church Sept. 27, 1827.
- 35. Secretary Mr. Peter Dyck jun. changed to the Evangelical Lutheran Church because he had bought some properties. According to certificate dated October 29, 1827.

- 36. Miss Johanna Mierau left our church for the Reformed Church in order to be able to marry & a certificate was made out and given to her on May 15, 1829. Note: As a result of an unhappy marriage she drowned herself on June 12, 1830.
- 37. Mr. Joh. Cornelius Wiehler, in order to be able to marry outside our church, and because in anticipation had already bought a house, left for another religion, at which time he took out his departure certificate. July 26, 1830.
- 38. Miss Margarethe Warkentien was excommunicated from the church because of an illegitimate birth, and went over to another religion. April 4, 1831.
- 39. Watchmaker Coworker Otto Tieszen was given a departure certificate for military reasons, so as to be able to travel abroad, July 12, 1831.
- 40. Merchant Peter Penner jun. according to departure certificate of January 23, 1832, left for another religion in order to join the military.
- 41. Merchant Frantz Eduard Wiebe, because of participation in a revolt, received his departure certification from the church, and took his certificate on Sept. 15, 1831, to join the Lutheran religion. Because of his participation in the revolt he was sentenced ca 1000 & 1 year imprisonment and loss of his national identity, January 16, 1832.
- 42. Painter Cornelius Jantzen from Tiegenhoff left with his certificate, dated March 12, 1832, into the unknown.
- 43. Miss Renathe Sudermann moved to Elbing with her church certificate, dated March 20, 1832.

## Leadership & Information

The beginning of our church leadership, and acceptance of the call by elders and teachers.

From Zur Geschichte der Mennoniten (Story of the Mennonites) by D. Wilh. Aichlon, 1786, published by Buchs (Books) 36 & 37.

Joh. Peter Sprunck, leader or deacon from 1721, some years as teacher, until 1743, since then Emeritus. Died 1757.

Jacob Simons and Barthel Kruse, Leaders

Cornelius Claaszen teacher from 1738 until 1766.

1. Heinrich Wielke. Elder from 1744 until 1748. Note: an exemplary man. Heinrich de Vain Leader, died 1754.

Isaai Kroeker. Leader. died 1755, as Emeritus.

Lambert von Dyck. Teacher 1744 to 1757.

David Zimmermann Leader 1747 to 1782 , when he came to the Lord (died?)on March 30

Wilhelm Reinke Teacher 1751 to 1758, whose previous life had been generally bemoaned.

Peter Sprunck Leader 1751 to 1758 and since then Teacher until 1763. Died 1767 as Emeritus.

2. Isaac Kroecker Teacher 1758 to 1767, when he was called to be Elder there, where

he died in 1786.

Isaai Kauenhower 1758 to 1763 when he became Teacher; died July 20, 1794.

Jacob Kroecker Leader 1763 to 1766 when he became Teacher; went to the Lord \$1777.\$

Zacharias Schroeder. Teacher since 1766. Died January 23, 179?.

Heinrich Kauenhower. Leader since 1766. During his term as leader, the church

burned down. Note: Should actually be Heinrich Kauenhowen, who died January 27, 1796.

Wilhelm Zimmermann, Teacher since October 12, 1777. Died Feb. 27, 1813.

Abr. Olfers, Leader since 1782. Died October 16, 1796

Heinrich Penner. Leader 1782. Became Teacher October 6, 1786. Died Sept. 14, 1830.

3. Johann Wiehler Teacher 1789, became Elder 1795. Died suddenly Nov. 11, 1820, in his 61st year.

Jacob Zimmermann May 10 1797. Leader, elected as Teacher May 27, 1813. Preached until July 28, 1816. Couldn't do justice to his parishioners and resigned. Died Nov. 22, 1819 at age 51.

Bernhard Wiehler  $\,$  May 10, 1797 Leader and master builder. Died Dec. 19, 1820.

Leader of the church 32 years 7 months.

4. Johann Penner Elected as Teacher May 27, 1813 and as Elder May 8, 1823; certified

 $\,$  by Honor. Elder Ab. Regier from Gurken near Marienburg on July 13, 18??.

Heinrich Dück, became Leader Dec. 8, 1816. Died July 19, 1821. He conducted his office well, with attention to the poor.

Heinrich Claaszen was elected Teacher on Dec. 8, 1816, postponed his acceptance

for some time, and delivered his first sermon on Jan. 9, 1820.

Daniel Wiens was elected Teacher on Dec. 8, 1816, but declined. Although he had been elected as leader and executed that office for many years, he declined the above position totally. Died January 13, 1824

Hermann Wiehler was elected Leader on October 17, 1819, but declined, received 26 votes.

Abr. Penner was elected Leader on October 17, 1819 in the poverty division, and on July 9, 1822, elected Teacher.

Isaac Wiens, who had been a Teacher in the Elbing church, moved; he was voted

in as Teacher on July 20, 1817; was asked by the brethren on June 13, 1820, to continue his calling here, for which Elder Hon. Ab. Regier installed him.

Mr. Isaac Wiens moved back to Elbing, his farewell sermon on Sept. 14, 1828, being based on Isaiah 55, 8.9. Joh. Penner spoke a few words based on Acts 20, 37. 38 to the departing Teacher.

Hermann Wientz was elected as 2nd leader on July 9, 1822, and worked in the area of the poor.

News Surrounding the 100th Jubilee of the Church

On the last Sunday of the year (namely December 28, 1823) the Koenigsberg Mennonite Church celebrated its one-hundred-year anniversary of conducting free and open worship, protected by the state. The first Mennonites who settled here, only landholders, could meet only in scattered places, like scattered sheep without shepherds and leaders, as well as teachers and preachers, built themselves up into a congregation. They delegated the pious members, Mr. Joh. Peter Sprunck, Mr. Jacob Schroeder, Mr. Isaai Kroecker to present a written request to His Majesty Friedrich Wilhelm the First. Later they received a notice, on April 2, 1722, Discretionary (?) Privilege, stating that they would not only be tolerated in the kingdom, but could also build a private house of worship in Koenigsberg for worshiping freely under the protection of the rulers. If the church here began by means of these privileges, it is assumed that renting a house or a hall, and electing a religious teacher by the year 1723 could be taken for granted. Since no information could be found regarding on which Sunday they held their first public worship service and dedicated the church, the last Sunday of the jubilee year 1823 was regarded as such and celebrated in a worthy manner with heartfelt participation.

On the day preceding the hundred-year public God-honoring worship, the church was notified of the same, and not earlier because it was not to be generally publicized among other curious religious relatives

outside church members, so as not to crowd them out, which might result in disturbance. This was accomplished and the inner room of the church was filled. Church members were in the church at 10 minutes after 9 o'clock, and the service began with the singing of the hymn from the Danzig Hymnal, which we were using , No. 159, "Great God, full of Majesty." Before the singing of the last verse the chuch leadership, according to custom, came into the church, but I, who was preaching, took my place in front of the communion table, and following the final verse, offered David's prayer, and at its conclusion announced the theme song, No. 509, "Praise, Honor and Laud the Highest Good." I went to the usual preaching spot and after the hymn had been sung, began my prepared sermon, in which I spoke about the great importance and the true worth of open and communal worship of God. After the sermon the first verse of Hymn No. 520 was sung: "Our God, the God of Honor," and the hymn No. 513, "Now Thank we all our God" closed the day's festivity begun with the gratitude of every Mennonite. It is worth noting that the introduction to the sermon was taken from Psalm 84, v 2 & 3 and the text from Exodus 20, v. 24. In my sermon I mentioned all the Elders and Teachers, who in the past 100 years had held the office of Evangelical Mennonite Teacher in this church; may the object of my sermon be realized by the church members, and the Lord bless the efforts of his servant in building up of the church members, and fulfill the words in 1. Kings 8, v. 57. -- The church leadership consisted of 1 elder, 4 teachers, 2 leaders, namely Joh. Penner, Heinrich Penner, Isaac Wiens, Heinr. Claaszen, Abr. Penner, Bern. Wiehler .... (illegible)

Continuation of Church Leadership, with interesting changes.

On Nov. 14, 1824, the newly installed organ was dedicated with the text Math. 5,? and the singing of Hymn No. 159, "Great God, full of Power," after which the organ was dedicated. With the singing of the 1st and 7th verses, the first organ accompaniment began, with my son Cornelius Penner playing.

On June 5, 1825, the pulpit and communion table were dedicated to their intended use; from that time until now in the same place, both draped with a green cloth.

Abraham Claaszen was asked on March 24, 1829, as can be seen on Page 363, according to the wish of the church leadership and membership, to retake his former position, which he had earlier accepted, but under pressure from church leadership resigned until his home situation would change. He asked for time until fall to discern whether or not he should take the position again. Since we did not want to continue with this indecision any longer, much rather have a new election, he was given 8 days to decide together with his wife and announce his decision. On March 31, 1829, in the company of the church leadership and 2 church members he declared himself willing to accept the position of Teacher in fall. Since that time, when he accepted the position of Teacher, he has been acknowledged as such.

Joh. Penner sen.

Note: On Nov. 29, 1829, the first Sunday of Advent, the above-mentioned preached his first sermon on 1 Cor. 4, v. 1-5, which turned out well, above all expectations. May the Highest make him and us more and more capable in this ??.

- Mr. Gerhard von Roy was elected leader on Dec. 27, 1831; works in construction. Note: Mr. Van Roy moved to Danzig and resigned from his position on October 4, 1832.
- Mr. Herrmann Warkentien was elected as first leader of the church on November 4, 1832. He is working in construction. The same was elected as preacher on and is conducting his position with (integrity?).
- Mr. Abr. Tieszen was elected leader of the church on  $\phantom{a}$  . He works in construction.
- Preacher candidate Carl Harder delivered his first sermon as Religion Teacher on May 11, 1845, the first day of Pentecost. On April 20 and 27, 1845, he was nominated as preacher of this church and was duly installed. On April 27 Ô45 it
- was decided, by means of volunteer contributions, to give him an annual allowance of 300 rttt for a term of 3 years, that is from Michael's 1845 to Michael's
- 1848, discussed orally with Mr. Warkentin, but nothing in writing, also that the
  - money designated for him be kept in an account and given to him so that during his term of office he need not worry. For the rest God will provide.
