## Mennonite Men Married to non-Mennonites in West Prussia: 1799

The following is a list of Mennonite men who were married to non-Mennonites as of 1799. All were married to either Lutheran or Catholic women. Those identifiable in the GRanDMA database have database numbers added in the Names column. Some men have measurements in Zoll (inches) and Strüh (unknown). The numbers are not consistent with heights of the men. The last two columns provide the page and entry numbers for these men, as they are found in another ledger, which is not available.

Outside marriage was a very contentious issue during the first decades under Prussian rule and caused at least one church schism. For a first-hand account of this issue see the diary of Aeltester Heinrich Donner.

## Danzig, November 4th, 1799 Ostarstein

Any and all children of the 36 spurious Mennonite families listed here and of the one stepson of Jacob Tillitzki mentioned under No. 28 are obliged under article 10 of the edict of July 30th, 1789, to adopt that religion which [unclear; poss. "one of"] their parents or grandparents belonged to and was a true member of the Mennonite religion. Even though this may include families who do not have living sons, they may have daughters, who according to the aforementioned edict are considered to be women belonging to a religion other than the Mennonite religion and whose future male descendants shall be liable to military service.

The three people mentioned opposite are liable to military service for the reasons given above, which is why we ask to repeal their Mennonite religion, and even more so in light of their declaration to the conscription revision commission that they are unable to provide any foreigners to take their place due to lack of money.

These three people mentioned opposite are from true Mennonite families who are by birth not liable to conscription; however, if these people, who according to the conditions of all religions have achieved the age of consideration, choose to shirk all morality by not adopting a religion, they do not deserve the same protection from military service as the Mennonites. In this regard and considering the fact that this is the first case of this kind in the [unclear; poss. "Prussian"] monarchy that may give rise to a class of people who by their arbitrary system may in future disrupt the best conditions of

the [ill.], I leave it to His [ill.] whether to urge them to immediately adopt a religion or to make them join my [ill.; poss. "mentioned below"] regiment.
